



# MORE THAN 70,000 ATTEND YANNICK NÉZET-SÉGUIN AND THE OM'S SUMMER SEASON EVENTS

50,000 people at the foot of Mount Royal and 16,000 people in Montreal parks 15 works and 11 concerts including 1 live broadcast on Medici.TV

Montreal, Thursday, August 11, 2022 - The Orchestre Métropolitain's (OM) summer season concluded last Sunday at the Festival de Lanaudière, following a marathon of 11 concerts between July 8 and August 7. More than 70,000 new and experienced music lovers, families and individuals came together in the boroughs of Montreal, at the Domaine Forget in Charlevoix, at the Festival des Arts de Saint-Sauveur, and at the Festival de Lanaudière. These privileged musical gatherings were eagerly awaited by members of the public who were truly captivated and thrilled to be together and reconnect with Beethoven, Debussy, Tchaikovsky, Schumann, and Rossini, and to enthusiastically discover the works of Airat Ichmouratov and Barbara Assiginaak, as well as those of Louise Farrenc.

### The OM Alfresco: 16,000 people in Montreal parks!

More than 16,000 people gathered in the parks of the boroughs of LaSalle, Rivière-des-Prairies-Pointe-aux-Trembles, Ahuntsic-Cartierville and the Théâtre de Verdure in the Plateau-Mont-Royal to hear the OM in a mix of classical works and new discoveries. Under the direction of Montreal conductor Mélanie Léonard and hosted by musicologist Marilou Garon, these concerts launched the OM's summer season in a most exciting way!

#### 50,000 people at the foot of Mount Royal!

The highlight of the summer was undoubtedly the grand return of the OM's concert at the foot of Mount Royal, conducted by Yannick Nézet-Séguin and hosted by Pénélope McQuade. This event alone brought together nearly 50,000 people, a record crowd for the Orchestra! Everyone will remember the surprise encore offered by the Orchestra and its conductor: **A Fifth of Beethoven** by American composer Walter Murphy, a disco adaptation of the first movement of the symphony they had just performed, wrapping up an electrifying evening!

#### The return of international artists

The 2022 summer season also saw the much-anticipated return of international artists to the OM. From the USA, tenor Lawrence Brownlee, baritone Michael Spyres, and soprano Meagan Sill performed in a Rossini concert led by French conductor Ariane Matiakh. Then, a "Wagner triumvirate" from the MET: Americans Christine Goerke, soprano and Brandon Jovanovich, tenor, and German bass Franz-Josef Selig literally conquered the Lanaudière public. Their performance was broadcast live by Medici.TV (available via webcast until November 7, 2022). To conclude the Festival de Lanaudière, the dazzling French pianist Hélène Grimaud gave a passionate and energetic rendition of Schumann's Piano Concerto.
