

2022 OMNI COMPETITION Young violist EMAD ZOLFAGHARI wins top honours 25 winners share over \$22,000 in scholarships

Montreal, Monday, June 13, 2022 – Yannick Nézet-Séguin and the Orchestre Métropolitain are pleased to announce that the winner of the 4th edition of the 2022 OMNI Competition is the young violist Emad Zolfaghari (photo), who was awarded the competition's François Schubert Grand Prize, one year after winning last year First Prize in the OMNI Competition Strings category. For a 4th consecutive year, young Canadian performers from 7 to 17 years of age were given the opportunity to demonstrate their musical talent in front of a jury. Among the thirty finalists, 25 young performers stood out in their respective categories: strings, winds, and piano, sharing scholarships and awards totalling more than \$22,000. This is proof that perseverance and determination are already inspiring young people to pursue their dreams and corroborates the OMNI Competition's mission to promote the practice of a musical instrument among young people.

Last year's Grand Prize Winner, young pianist Emmanuel Roberts Dugal recognizes the importance of the OMNI Competition in his musical career: "In addition to being an enriching and highly formative experience, the OMNI Competition is by far the event that has opened the most doors for me. I played at Bourgie Hall during the final round of the Competition, I met jury members who offered me constructive and relevant comments, I gave a recital at the Chapelle historique du Bon-Pasteur and I had the immense privilege of being invited by Yannick Nézet-Séguin to perform with him and the OM during their 6th Benefit Gala. This is, without a doubt, the foremost event of my early career and it provides me with the impetus to continue working and pursuing my path in music. I will forever be grateful for what the OMNI Competition has given me!"



From the Competition to the Stage with the OM — Emad Zolfaghari is the recipient of several awards, among them he won in 2021 **First Prize in the Strings Category of the OMNI Competition**. As a result of his accomplishments, **he will perform next season with the Orchestre Métropolitain as guest soloist in the youth production** <u>*Le pelleteur de nuages*</u>. Emad Zolfaghari is currently studying at the Curtis Institute of Music with Hsin-Yun Huang. His young career includes collaborations with the Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra, the Phil and Eli Taylor Performance Academy for Young Artists, the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, the Guelph Symphony Orchestra and the Oakville Chamber Orchestra.

Last year's winner in the Winds Category 12 to 14 years old, saxophonist Heidi Robichaud will also participate in *Le pelleteur de nuages*, which will take place on Sunday, April 2 at 3 p.m at the Maison symphonique.
