A kaleidoscope. That's the image that comes to mind when I think about this season, in all its vivid colours. Like music, it is dynamic, changing, always moving and evolving. As we listen to different pieces and movements, music brings out the different sides of our humanity and takes us through a range of emotions.

The palette is rich and infinite: passionate red, melancholic grey, joyful yellow, tormented blue, envious green, tender pink ... And it's when we're all together that these emotions come to life. Each person in the concert hall interprets them according to their own perspective, making the music whole and alive. It vibrates!

This shared and unique experience is recreated at each Orchestre Métropolitain concert, whether it's at the Maison symphonique or across the city. Magic unfolds each time, like in the experiments of Dukas's Sorcerer's Apprentice or when, night after a thousand and one nights, Rimsky-Korsakov's Scheherazade lives on thanks to its enchanting tales. Throughout the season, the OM will perform many of these masterpieces that have been lighting up hearts for decades. The wonders of Mahler's Sixth, Sibelius's Second and Shostakovich's Seventh will be accompanied by some hidden gems. Together, we'll discover lost treasures written by Augusta Holmès, Amy Beach and Johan Halvorsen, alongside some jewels cut more recently by Kaija Saariaho, Anna Clyne and Cris Derksen.

Our guest conductors and soloists will shine with us. Among them are Quebecers who make us proud on the world stage and international stars we're honoured to introduce to our orchestra, and above all, to our fabulous audience.

Yes, you, dear audience. You're the focal point of this grand musical kaleidoscope. Your presence brings all the colours to life, makes melodies sing and sends our musicians' hearts aflutter.

Together, let's make this season shine in all its splendour.

SUMMIT

Bruce Liu made history at the 18th International Chopin Piano Competition for being the first Canadian to be awarded First Prize. Now he's returning home to tackle more spirited repertoire: Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 2.

The first notes of the season will be from composer Cris Derksen. In its world premiere, Derksen's piece creates a space where classical and electronic music encounter the Cree Nation worldview. Under the baton of Yannick Nézet-Séguin, the OM will continue its Sibelius symphonic cycle with Symphony No. 2—a masterpiece with tempestuous ambiance, in the spirit of Finnish resistance and dramatic climes.

FROM SOLOIST TO MAESTRO

Andreas Ottensamer, the world's most sought-after clarinetist, will combine his talents as conductor and soloist for an enchanting performance of Romantic repertoire. The Austrian virtuoso is the OM's artist in residence for the 2023–2024 season.

Following Brahms's melancholic Tragic Overture and lyrical Concerto No. 1, the stage is set for hope and sensuality. Augusta Holmès's symphonic poem *La nuit et l'amour*, recalling Wagner, was written in the Romantic style with an emphasis on melody. Finally, Schumann's first symphony, also known as the Spring Symphony, evokes flowers and colours in bloom.



ONE THOUSAND AND ONE DRUMS

Inspired by Rimsky-Korsakov's overseas adventures and his ability to make an orchestra sing just as he envisioned, *Scheherazade* is as enchanting as the courtesan tales from *One Thousand and One Nights*. Under the baton of Elim Chan, a young female conductor with international star power, the tales' distinct colours intermingle to the pleasure of musicians and audiences alike.

It may be the middle of the night, but *This Midnight Hour* by British composer Anna Clyne doesn't care what the neighbours think. This immersive piece brings the audience along on a wild, melancholic, nocturnal journey. Percussionist Dominique Vleeshouwers performs the stunning *Speaking Drums* by Hungarian composer Peter Eötvös, where the soloist literally speaks to the snare drum, bell and other instruments with contagious glee.

THE LENINGRAD SYMPHONY

Our conductor Yannick Nézet-Séguin takes a passionate and exacting dive into Shostakovich's Symphony No. 7 to make the piece shine. Written during World War II, the Leningrad symphony instantly became a symbol of hope and solidarity. Nearly a century later, it's still disquietingly topical.

One of the world's most renowned soloists, Maria Dueñas performs a jewel from the repertoire that was thought to be lost forever: Halvorsen's Violin Concerto. The Norwegian composer's piece was found a few years ago at the University of Toronto.

FIRE AND FLAME

Prokofiev's fifth symphony is a mature composition, written 14 years after his previous symphonic work. This ode to freedom and happiness was completed during World War II and features a joy that prevails and explodes like fireworks under the baton of Kensho Watanabe.

Just as fiery, Latvian composer Lūcija Garūta's concerto is a little-known gem that will be performed by Quebec-born, London-based pianist Élisabeth Pion. But *The Sorcerer's Apprentice* will cast a spell to get the first sparks flying. This piece was written by Dukas, Garūta's teacher.

FROM THE ABYSS TO THE STARS

Two major international opera stars will join Yannick Nézet-Séguin in a sublime search for light. Soprano Janai Brugger delivers a consistently stunning performance of *Gloria*, the French composer Poulenc's masterpiece. Mezzo-soprano Karen Cargill will explore profound human suffering to find glimmers of hope in her performance of Psalm 130, "Out of the Depths." Listen closely to the parallels between these two choral works and discover how Poulenc was inspired by Lili Boulanger's musical writings.

The first successful American female composer drew on her Irish roots to compose the Gaelic Symphony. She paints a masterful portrait of the resilient migrants who, despite all their challenges, manage to keep the flame of their culture alive through folklore.

ITALIAN DREAM

The concert starts off with a bang as *Don Juan* bursts onto the stage and dives head first into his romantic—and musical—adventures! From one symphonic poem to the next, Strauss takes us through Italy with *Aus Italien*, visiting four sunny destinations: the Roman countryside, the nostalgic Roman ruins, the beach at Sorrento and a Neapolitan celebration.

The audience will then take flight with flutist Juliette Hurel's performance of *Aile du songe*, a concerto by composer Kaija Saariaho who draws crowds and has worked with an impressive roster of artists such as writer Amin Maalouf and theatre director Peter Sellars.

In 2020, Glass Marcano's life changed overnight. She went from selling fruit in Venezuela to participating in the major conducting competition La Maestra in Paris, where she won over the jury and brought home the Orchestra Prize.

This major turning point is illustrated in this two-part program. First, her roots can be found in the works of South American composers. Then, she tackles Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 4.





Human encounters and oral traditions are the foundation of all choreographer Rhodnie Désir's work. After the extraordinary trajectory of BOW'T TRAIL, which brought her work to seven countries in the Americas, she's taken on another large-scale project in collaboration with composer Jorane, sound designer Engone Endong, the RD Créations House Band, the Orchestre Métropolitain and the National Film Board to create immersive projections.

Rhodnie Désir, winner of the 2020 Grand Prix de la Danse de Montréal and Place des Arts Associate Artist, choreographs a large-scale project for 15 dancers and 60 Orchestre Métropolitain musicians, conducted by Yannick Nézet-Séguin. As a "bearer of memories," Désir is fascinated by the intricacies and vicissitudes of the human heart. Based on statements by specialists from the Montreal Heart Institute, she translates the beating heart into the gestural, while also considering its turmoil and flaws, in a nod to the flaws of society.
